

## WOUNDED WAKEFIELD AND DISTRICT SOLDIERS.

Wakefield and district soldiers have been taking part in the British offensive, and information has been received that the following have been wounded:—

Lieut. Bernard Gordon Anderson, of the Lincolns, son of Mr. R. G. L. Anderson, of the York-street Academy, Wakefield.

Lieut. Percy Dobinson, Durham Light Infantry, son of Mr. L. Dobinson, Stanley. He has been shot through the thigh.

Lieut. C. E. Sutcliffe, West House, Belle Vue, Wakefield, has been slightly wounded by the bursting of a high explosive shell, and is now in hospital in London.

Lieut. O. D. Dixon, K.O.Y.L.I., of Pinderfields-road, Wakefield, an old Grammar School boy, and a prominent member of the Wakefield Rugby Football Club, is now in a hospital in Manchester.

Private H. F. Bennett, K.O.Y.L.I., Princess-yard, Kirkgate, Wakefield.

Private Arthur Buckley, of the Lincolns, son of Mr. George Buckley, Selby-street, Wakefield.

Corporal H. T. Loxley, Royal Engineers, son of Mr. T. B. Loxley, managing director of the Yorkshire Railway Waggon Company, Wakefield.

Sergeant Earnshaw, York and Lancaster Regiment, of Darton, a old Territorial.

Private Percy Meunsey, York and Lancaster Regiment, of Darton, who is at present in a military hospital in England.

Private Harry Garforth, York and Lancaster Regiment, of Woolley Colliery, who is in a military hospital in Birmingham.

Private Norman Coatesworth, of the K.O.Y.L.I., of Woodley.

Sergeant Sidney Waite, K.O.Y.L.I., of Quebec-street, Wakefield, has been hit in the back by a shell. Previous to enlisting he worked at Messrs. G. Cradock and Co.'s.

Private Frank Easter, York and Lancaster Regiment, Lawfield-lane, Westgate Common, Wakefield, who previous to joining the Forces worked at Messrs. Reynolds, Stott, and Haslegrave.

Cadet Lance-Corporal Charles N. Spencer, Royal Irish Rifles (Pioneers), who was wounded by a shell in the right arm on July 2nd, is now in the Norfolk War Hospital, Thorpe, Norwich. Spencer, who is only eighteen years of age, is the son of Mr. W. Spencer, St. John's
