## ARRESTS OF NOTE

45-year-old male arrested on suspicion of theft from motor vehicle x3 and vehicle interference in Thornes.

## WAKEFIELD CENTRAL

### DRUGS & CASH SEIZED

At around 3pm on 13 October, PC Mills stopped a vehicle on Thornhill Street that he had seen acting suspiciously.

The driver was found to be in possession of class A drugs and a quantity of cash. He was arrested on suspicion of possession with intent to supply a class A drug.

### LUPSET DISPERSAL ORDER

Acting on recent reports of anti-social behaviour in the Lupset area, Insp Brear authorised a dispersal order. This is the authority to ban anyone committing, or likely to commit, anti-social behaviour or crime from a designated area for up to 48 hours, offering respite to a community.

Officers attended and a number of dispersal notices were issued to the individuals involved. If found to be breaching this order they will be liable to a fine and/or prison.

If there are continuing problems of anti-social behaviour, we will work with the Council and other appropriate partners to find longer-term solutions.
