POLICE NEWS

CASTLEFORD NPT

48HR DISPERSAL ORDER

We operated a 48 hour Dispersal Order in Castleford Town Centre over the weekend. This afforded us extra powers to remove people from the area who were acting in an anti-social manner.

We issued 15 orders. 3 people were arrested for breaching the order and 1 person was charged and remanded from the arrest.

SHOP WATCH LAUNCHED

A brand new Shop watch scheme was launched on the 30th July in Castleford, approximately 20 businesses will be on board with an expansion planned. Shop watch allows businesses to take more control in monitoring prolific shop lifters in town centers. It also allows us to work closer with retailers in targeting and bringing offenders to justice.

Two Prolific Shoplifters have been issued with a Criminal Behaviour Order banning them both from a number of premises within the Castleford area.
